

FACTS vs FALSEHOODS:

Fact #1: Since 2013, I have missed exactly 8 board meetings! My opponent falsely suggests I have a poor attendance record at Board Meetings, twisting the statistics with convoluted math to fool you.

THE TRUTH:

- In 2013, the County began posting Board minutes on-line for anyone to research and read.
- According to County records I have missed only 8 meetings during that 13-year period. I was similarly diligent in attendance prior to that.
- When the casino matter comes before the board, I must step out, and when concluded, I step back into the meeting, only missing that one agenda item, no matter when it appears before the board.

Fact #2: My opponent hides from you the fact that she herself cannot vote on Plymouth casino issues.

THE TRUTH:

- My opponent owns land directly adjacent to the new casino in Plymouth, and she cannot represent you!
- Four years ago, while campaigning against me, she stated she was selling her property to remove her conflict – she never did.
- My opponent still owns the ground.
- In fact, my property is 1 mile from the casino. I have made a renewed request from the FPPC on whether I can now vote on any related matters since the casino is now built.

Fact #3: My opponent says she brings new ideas, but the only solution she has proposed is to create another committee!

THE TRUTH:

- The only specific proposal she has offered is to form an Advisory Committee to meet 4 times a year, listening to her constituents only quarterly and filtered through a committee process.

- Mine is an open-door policy; I am readily available to anyone, inviting you to ask questions and share your concerns with me, your elected official, any time, on YOUR schedule.
- Forming committees is what politicians do... it leads to nothing but time spent and avoids responsibility for the elected official's decisions.
- Constituents want representation by those elected to office, not their appointed committee members – committees that quite often end up leaning to one side.
- It is as if she has great ideas none of the other five current Supervisors together can find, but she is keeping them all to herself.
- It has been four years since she made the same claims in her first campaign – yet there are none listed on her website. What are her solutions and fresh ideas?

Fact #4: My opponent's appearance before the Board of Supervisors has been minimal since 2013 (Since her 2020 Campaign, she spoke only 5 times!)

THE TRUTH:

- While she attacks me for my absences (only 8 meetings in 13 years), she has rarely appeared before the Board.
- She spoke once in 2020.
- Twice in 2021.
- In 2022, her first campaign year, she spoke at almost every meeting. She lost the election.
- She returned once in December 2023 to speak on winery issues, but she was silent on the road agenda item that day.
- In 2024 she spoke twice.
- In 2025 she was absent.
- January 2026 through April 14 she spoke twice, without addressing the issues she calls top priority today.

Do not fall for her claim that she has “new ideas” and that it is simply “time for change”.

Question if she has any fresh ideas.

Question the type of change she is after.

Question why she shows up only while campaigning!

I trust you will be disappointed.
